
The rich estate of the German-Jewish psychoanalyst Ruth C. Cohn (1912 - 2010) came to the archive of the Humboldt University of Berlin via the heirs Helga Herrmann and Matthias Kroeger.

In her American exile, the Berlin-born "social therapist", who won many awards, developed a concept of lively learning and working in small and large groups, based on appreciation and promoting development, which has proven itself in many areas – Theme-Centered Interaction (TCI). She was concerned with the preservation of humanistic values and the awareness of the effect of the personal actions of each individual on the world.



Thanks to the indexing and registration of the extensive material by Matthias and Michaela Scharer, Ruth C. Cohn's estate is now available for further research and for interested parties.

On the occasion of the opening of the estate, we invite you to a scientific symposium, which is dedicated to the person of Ruth C. Cohn and her work in their historical and social contexts, but which also exemplarily illuminates the significance of TCI for today.
